NICFI Program Q3 Update (Oct 2021)



This third quarterly report provides an update of the activities completed in this quarter, the data available and key statistics and metrics gathered from insights collected by the project team, including the status of roll out to the General Partners.

News and Media

In this last quarter media there has been widespread activity in the media and through the project partners about the program. computer. RfP open from 27th Sept – 27th Nov







97 countries included in the NICFI program with over 9002 registered users from 136 countries worldwide. To date,23.6 million tiles streamed from Planet Explorer.



Resources and Helpdesk

Tier one support has handled 47 tickets in this quarter (193 overall) with issues or questions typically resolved within hours. Most commonly these have been on topics of download and discovery, access through other platforms such as GEE and requests around more information on the program and how the data can be used.

Enablement materials such as FAQs and User guides now available in 5 languages (English, Spanish, French, Portuguese and Bahasa Indonesian) and the User Guide has also been recently updated in response to the launch program. Additional resources including a community page are now available for users providing a centralised resource. Update to the launch page is expected in the next quarter to ensure clarity and ease of use.

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User Story Highlights

Skytruth has integrated the Level 1 data into their platform, making it available to use as part of their Alerts system with other public sources such as Landsat and Sentinel. This allows the user easily compare images and identify where changes have occurred with more detail, in a tool familiar to them.



Collect Earth Online's Geo-Dash tool is provided users the opportunity to verify cases of degradation identified with higher resolution data. The Geo-Dash tool (which uses Landsat and Sentinel data to create time series indices of land degradation) can be used with the Level 1 data to validate changes directly in Collect Earth Online



User survey

250 participants responded to a survey in July 2021. Key outcomes and takeaways are summarised below.



- The users have been heavily using Planet's platforms and GIS plugins
- 75% of users store geospatial data locally
- GEE s still the most prominent request validating partnership in lead up to launch
- Users are asking for shorter tutorials on how to access and analysis the data

Partner profile – Mapbiomas

MapBiomas is produced by a collaborative network of co-creators made up of NGOs, universities and technology companies. Their platforms enable users, especially in South America, the chance to work with the NICFI data in tools familiar to them. As the platform is adapted to display the data they have already reported the value of the data from the NICFI program for validation using the Level 1 mosaics for pre-validation to reduce false positives in alerting and then evaluating the remaining alerts with scenes level data
